CPMHA COVID 19 Housekeeping Guidelines:

- Please arrive no sooner than 15 minutes before your ice slot and leave promptly after your ice time to allow for proper cleaning/disinfecting and to keep the facilities on schedule. (15 minutes)
- Social/Physical distancing and masks must be worn and abided by at all times
 - Players/Coaches will be permitted to remove their mask prior to exiting the changeroom to enter the ice.
 - o Following practise and removal of helmets; masks are required to be worn
- One (1) parent or guardian per player will be admitted to the facility to ensure a maximum capacity of 50 people as mandated by the Province and Public Health is not exceeded.

Entering the facilities (ELRC & PERC):

- You will enter through the main entrance where each "cohort" (assigned teams) will have a
 gatekeeper completing COVID screening and recording your name, player's name and phone
 number as required for Public Health.
- We will not be collecting money for admission this season.
- Once you have signed-in: Your player will go to their assigned change room to put their skates
 on. (Player's are expected to arrive with everything on but their skates/helmets and goalies
 everything but their skates/helmets and goalie pads)
- There will be no warm room seating so please dress accordingly to view the game in the assigned spectator's area of each facility.
- Food and drinks are prohibited except for the players' personal water bottle.
- It is recommended after you have entered either facility; that you stay in the arena as re-admittance may not be possible.

Exiting the facilities immediately following the allotted ice-time:

- **PERC; Milverton:** Spectators will exit through the tower (exit near booth) and will not re-enter the lobby.
 - *Player's will exit the dressing room hallway exit.
- **ELRC**; **Monkton**: Spectators and Players will exit through their assigned changeroom hall to the furthest arena exit at the end of the ice resurfacer hall.
